

Chrismon: The Uryc Family

Reading: "CHRISMON" is a combination of parts of two words: CHRISt
and MONogram. Wayside Church made Chrismon ornaments to celebrate the
birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. The Book of Luke, chapter 2, vividly tells the
visitation of the Angels to the shepherds announcing and praising God for the
birth of Jesus, "Glad tidings of great joy." The excitement and wonder can be felt
by us today. It is a moment when heaven and earth connect. After delivering this
awesome news, the sky filled with Angels singing praise.
